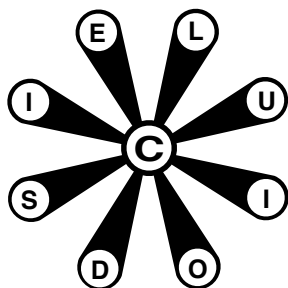
Work out all the missing parts from these foods that were named after places and find the words hidden in the box of letters. The letters left over will spell out a drink you might wash them down with.

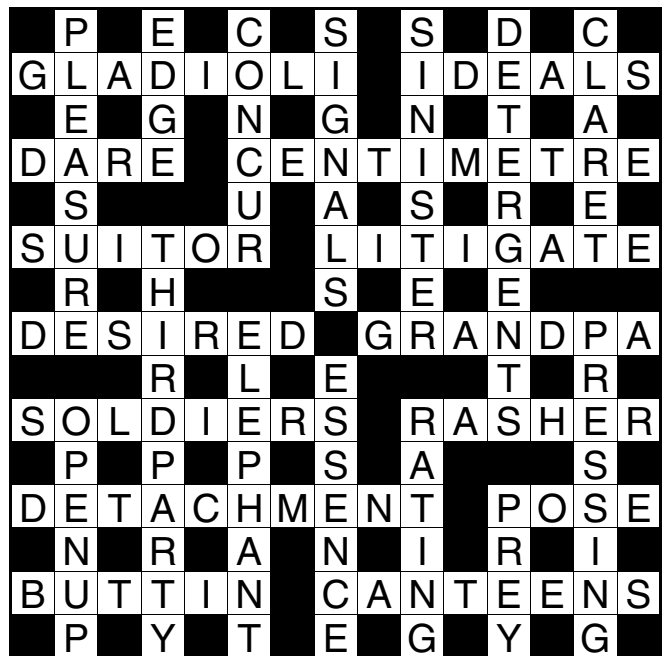
