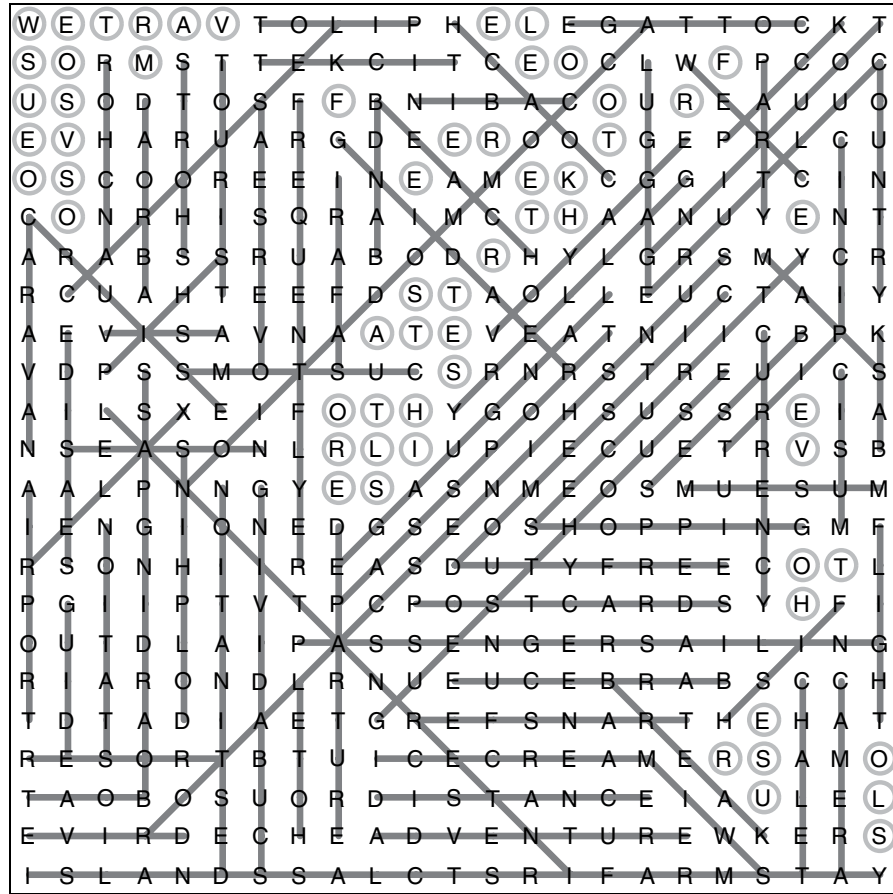


MONSTER FIND-A-WORD TRAVEL

WE TRAVEL, SOME OF US FOREVER, TO SEEK OTHER STATES, OTHER LIVES, OTHER SOULS.

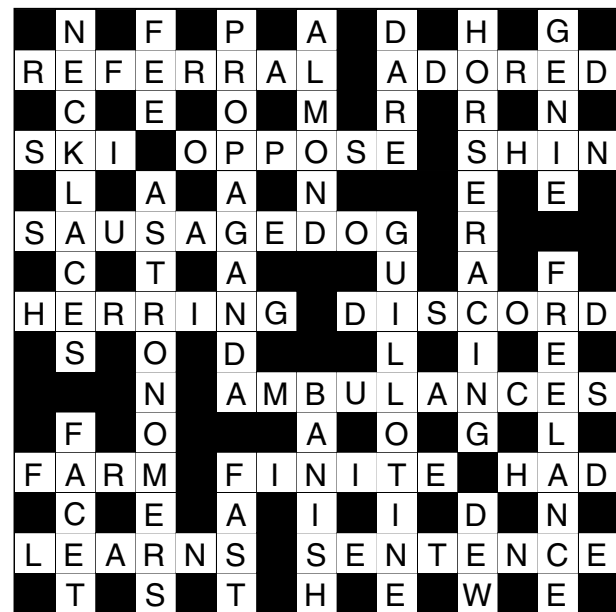

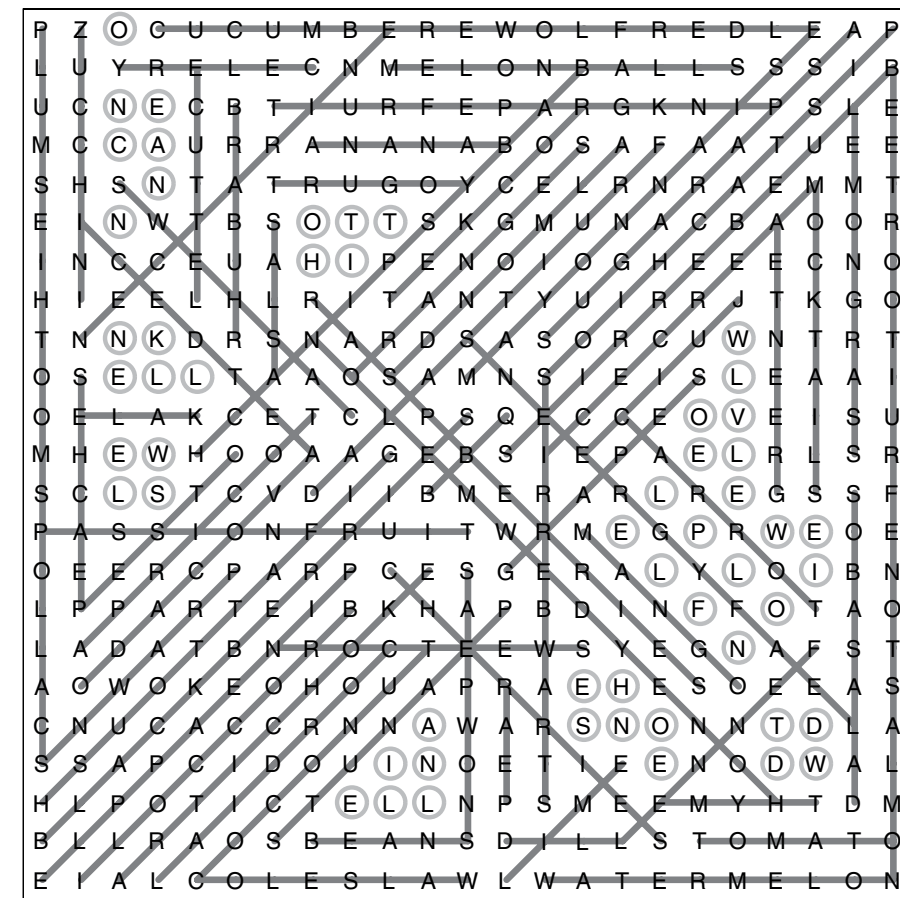
